President, Pat Sanford

I am dedicated to AAUW's mission: Advancing equity for women and girls through advocacy, education, philanthropy, and research. This year it has been my pleasure to highlight our mission and focus on empowerment. With your support, I would like to serve in the position of president for a second year to continue these efforts.

Before retiring in August 2014, I was the Director of Leadership Development and Safe and Drug Free Schools in the North East Independent School District. I provided extensive leadership training for administrators in the district. I also supervised the Safe and Drug Free Schools program which includes PALS (Peer Assistance Leadership and Service).

Before coming to North East ISD, I was an Education Specialist at ESC-20; the Program Coordinator for the American Lung Association Alamo Region; and co-founded Camp Broncho, a camp for children with moderate to severe asthma. I began my career as a high school English and journalism teacher. I have a BS degree in English and education from the University of Wisconsin at Madison and a Master's of Public Health degree from the University of Illinois in Chicago. I'm married and have one son who is an attorney.

I have always looked at ways to contribute to AAUW. Co-President-Elect fits perfectly with my winter stay in San Antonio.
