Did You Know?

Congratulate yourselves! Your AAUW annual dues--and those of Branches all over the US-- have met the goal of fully-funding the AAUW Fellowships! Fellowships such as the Community Action Grant that Kimberly Sama is using this year in San Antonio to help girls in lower socio-economic areas develop their creativity in writing computer code and exploring STEM subjects. Kimberly was Featured Speaker at the December, 2015, Branch meeting. Fellowships that assist women like this month's Featured Speaker, Lydia Light, an American Fellowship Grant Winner. Read about her elsewhere in this Newsletter and come hear her fascinating presentation at the May meeting.

Nowadays a new focus of scholarship funds is supporting girls of middle school age as they venture into the STEM fields. Tech Savvy is a day-long STEM conference designed to develop interests of middle school girls and help adults support these interests. Tech Trek is a week-long Science and Math summer camp conducted on a university campus to develop interest, excitement and self-confidence in 8th grade girls in these fields. There are very few Tech Trek camps throughout the country so far, even though Tech Trek has been around in California since 1998, and there is only one Tech Trek camp in all of Texas at this time--at Texas Tech University. An AAUW goal is to expand Tech Trek to other colleges and universities throughout the nation.

Something Else You Ought to Know!

Did you know that AAUW Texas has its own AAUW American Fellowship Grant? It is in honor of the late Ann Richards. But we can't honor our favorite outspoken Governor yet! The grant must first be fully-funded at \$200,000 before women scholars will have access to fellowships in her name. We are more than halfway there! You can "Step into Action" by donating to this fund at the Convention or by making a donation to the 2015-2016 Ann Richards AAUW American Fellowship Grant Funding Drive.

Featured Speaker




Lydia Light, AAUW American Fellowship Grantee

What is it like attempting to navigate today's university science doctoral programs? How does a woman scientist overcome gender bias to be accepted as a PhD candidate and emerge, degree in hand, after a number of years in field and laboratory? How does an AAUW Grant assist her in her journey?

Lydia Light, our featured speaker for May and PhD Candidate, ABD, at the University of Texas at San Antonio, will give us insight into these questions. She is a Grant recipient in AAUW's American Fellowship program for 2015-2016 whose Anthropology research with gibbons, our primate relatives, deals with their "...flexible mating systems and social monogamy...." as a way to better understand humans' evolutionary past. She will help us understand how ecological factors influence behavior and will relate some of her experiences in her field work in Western Thailand.

Some of us have enjoyed Lydia's company on walks with the Wandering Wonders, and we offer her our sincerest wishes of good luck as she prepares to defend her dissertation this month.
