The sixtieth session of the Commission on the Status of Women will take place at the United Nations Headquarters in New York from March 14 – 24, 2016.

A panel consisting of experts in education, law, and human rights will discuss the challenges and successes in eliminating violence against women and girls and promoting empowerment through education and lifelong learning. AAUW was invited to participate on March 16, 2016, in the annual Commission on the Status of Women because we are an ECOSOC – accredited nongovernmental organization.

The Priority theme for this year's conference will center on: Women's empowerment and its link to sustainable development. The theme from the previous conference will review the topic of:

The elimination and prevention of all forms of violence against women and girls.

April is Scholarship Month





It's that time of year again! A time for one of our favorite programs. It's Scholarship time!

The Graduate and Textbook Scholarships given by AAUW San Antonio each year to area women attending local colleges and universities will be awarded at the April meeting.

Karen Reichensperger, Chairman of the Scholarship Committee notes the quality of winning applicants is always high, and they have sucessfully gone through a rigorous process to merit their awards.


Graduate Scholarship (\$2,000) winners must meet grade point requirements of at least 3.0 on a 4 point system, be enrolled at an accredited university in Bexar County and registered for at least 6 semester hours in a program leading to a graduate degree, submit an official transcript of their work, submit a letter of recommendation from their department, and write an essay detailing their academic accomplishments, service in the community, plans for the future as well as demonstrating financial need. Applicants must also have been residents in Bexar or 7 other nearby counties for a minimum of 2 years. They should have received no more than 1 previous AAUW Graduate Scholarship for their current degree program. PhD candidates must be enrolled at an accredited university in Texas for a minimum of 6 semester hours or be registered for dissertation hours.

Textbook Scholarship (\$500) recipients may be undergrad or graduate students. Each applicant must submit a letter of acceptance to a college or university in Bexar County, submit a transcript showing a 3.0 grade point average, and write a short essay of 250 words noting what her goals are and how a Textbook Scholarship would help achieve those goals.

Dr. Riechensperger has designed a ranking system that makes comparison of these requirements fair and efficient, enabling readers on the committee to evaluate each applicant easily. Once each reader has completed her rankings, they all meet to discuss and further evaluate each student.

Congratulations to Karen and her Readers for a job well done! We look forward to meeting the Scholarship winners and hearing their remarks on April 2.





AAUW SA Hosting State Convention

AAUW SA is stepping into action in a big way this spring when we host the 47th Biennial State Convention here in the Mission City on Friday and Saturday, April 29 and 30, and Sunday, May 1.

If you have never attended a state convention, do not miss this opportunity. Join Mayor Ivy Taylor in welcoming the attendees to San Antonio on Saturday morning. The theme of the convention: Step Into Action With AAUW runs through all the workshops and presentations. The opening session addresses the question: Why So Few Women In Politics? with a panel of women politicians. Workshops include how to take action on the issues of equal pay, human trafficking, immigration, diversity, and social media. The convention closes on Sunday with two generations of Andrades. Former Texas Secretary of State Hope Andrade will introduce her daughter-in-law Leticia Andrade the rising star executive from CST Brands (CornerStore). This year's convention promises to have plenty of interesting ideas by and for women.

The convention also offers lots of fun – starting with a reception on Friday night at the Hyatt Place and meals on Saturday, which are included in the registration price. Early Bird Registration of \$199 is available through March 30th.

Our Hard Working Convention Committee!




Excitement is building as state and local committees continue preparing for the 47th AAUW Texas Biennial State Convention. With the convention less than two months away, our 15 local committees meet monthly, work daily, and think Convention thoughts minute-by-minute to ensure that the convention is a great success. We want to thank all committee members for their commitment to Convention excellence. Here are the committees, committee members, and brief descriptions of their contributions to the Convention.

Heading the Local Arrangements Committee, the all-inclusive name for the 15 local committees, are Branch President, Pat Sanford, and Vice President of Programs, Fran Vetters. Both women are liaisons with the state convention committee, which requires daily communication, creating resources, working with local facilities, and more. Fran has worked tirelessly to recruit speakers, then obtain biographical information and pictures for the state newsletter and for the program booklet. Pat has most recently been working with branch presidents to secure advertising for the program booklet and getting bids for the printing of the booklet. Both Fran and Pat are working on the convention program booklet while coordinating efforts of the 15 local committees.

Registrars for the event are Sue Ewers and Leslie Goddard. In addition to creating the registration form, they will process all registrations ensuring that official delegates from each branch participate in regulation meetings and voting at the convention. The amount of organization this requires is enormous. Gayna Dupont, current Co-President Elect, is Treasurer for the Convention. Gayna's business background and academic degrees plus the fact that she is a CPA, make her ideal for this position. She has set up the PayPal option that some attendees prefer for registration.

Malinda Gaul, Vice President of Membership locally, a member of the AAUW State Board, and a member of the AAUW National Board of Directors, has secured speakers for keynote addresses, workshops, and panels. She is a fount of wisdom, sharing useful information from state meetings and convention committee conference calls. Malinda is also in charge of sponsorships for the convention. She is working on obtaining national and local sponsorship and has gotten a donation from HEB for the Friday night reception and donations from various Hill Country vineyards wine thus far. Malinda is also in charge of Transportation for the convention. The hotel has a shuttle to take participants to and from the Norris Center, the location of the convention and to local points of interest within a 5-mile radius of the hotel. But convention planners know that additional transportation will be needed. We will have volunteer drivers available to transport participants to and from the Norris Center. Because she is committed to AAUW and its mission, Malinda takes on all of this in addition to her full-time law career.





Susanne Benson and Jeanette Gittinger, current Co-Secretary of AAUW SA, are Vendor Co-Chairs. They have secured 17 vendors so far, and may obtain more. This is a position that requires knowledge of local talents and entrepreneurship as well as interpersonal skills. Shopping is always fun at a convention, and the quality of the vendors reflects on the convention organizers. Suzanne and Jeanette have vendors in place that will make us all look good.

Mynda McGuire, AAUW Funds Committee Chair, and Ann Marie Rehner, our current Branch Treasurer, are Decorations Co-Chairs. Mynda has extensive convention experience that is proving invaluable. Table centerpieces for lunch and dinner on Saturday support the Convention theme, "Step into Action with AAUW." The two, with help from Fran Vetters and Gayna Dupont, have been putting their heads together and their convention decorations are fun and classy. Mynda is also working on the Convention Program Booklet and has created a convention flyer that is being used throughout the state to promote the convention. In addition, she has produced an ad that highlights the diversity and depth of activities our branch offers. The ad will be featured in the convention program booklet.

Karen Reichensperger, current Co-President Elect of AAUW SA, is the Evaluation Chair. Karen works for FEMA and just completed chairing the Scholarship Selection Committees for the Branch. 
