Dues for college/university partners are normally based on the number of enrolled students. Obituary

Orrine Woinowsk. August 11, 1920 – March 3, 2012. Orrine was one of our super 50-year members. Joining AAUW in 1947, she was actually a 65-year member. As the Branch President from 1999 to 2001, she presided over the last Book Sale during her first year. That was followed by the first *Breaking the Glass Ceiling* event in her second year.

A graduate of San Antonio's Thomas Jefferson High School, she received her BA and BSLS degrees at Our Lady of the Lake University. As a librarian, Orrine had a Federal career in Japan and locations in the U.S. In addition to her support of AAUW activities she and her sister, the late June Woinowsk, were active in several arts and civic organizations.

Orrine's love of animals was legendary; as she cared for and fed many cats, birds and deer in her neighborhood. Her friends in the branch will miss Orrine's friendly smiles, and cheerful attitude and devotion to this branch.
