PUBLIC POLICY

As a reminder of our Public Policy Priorities for 2017-2019, AAUW supports and promotes: High-quality public education; the economic, social, and physical well-being of all persons; the right to privacy and freedom from violence; improvement of racial, ethnic, and gender justice; the belief that global interdependence requires national and international policies against human trafficking, and that those policies promote peace, justice, human rights, sustainable development, and mutual security for all.

In September, Secretary of Education Betsy DeVos rescinded part of the Title IX guidance protecting survivors of sexual assault on campus. The guidance has been replaced by a less robust Q&A guidance document, which is a rollback from the strong guidance that was in place. AAUW will continue to stand up to protect and defend Title IX and pursue its vigorous enforcement.

As the health care fight continues in efforts to repeal and replace the Affordable Care Act (ACA), it is anticipated that efforts will persist to slash Medicaid and eliminate the mandates for insurers to cover maternity, reproductive care, and preexisting conditions. AAUW will continue to oppose these efforts, which specifically put women's access to health care in danger and threaten their economic security.

Then AAUW Texas members went in smaller groups to visit the offices of as many Texas Representatives as possible, leaving information about AAUW and our issues. We had back hall passes which gave us access to senators, representatives, and news media we have only seen on television.
