Public Policy

Prominent women in the entertainment industry (actors, directors, producers) have announced the Time's Up Initiative to combat sexual harassment across industries. As part of the project, attorneys for the group have announced the creation of the Time's Up Legal Defense Fund, which will be administered by the National Women's Law Center. The Fund aims to provide resources to victims of sexual harassment, including funding and legal representation.

Human trafficking remains another issue with much more work to be done. All states should have statutes in place that address protection of victims, prosecution, and prevention. AAUW advocates for national and international policies against human

trafficking that promote protection, justice, human rights and mutual security for all people. If you are interested in engaging in this work at the state level, check out the <u>State Policy Trafficking Tool Kit</u> on the AAUW National website.

The second session of the 115th Congress convened in early January and the 2018 state legislative sessions kicked off around the nation. That means it's a great time to brush up on the advocacy resources available to you as a member of AAUW! 
Magnolia Pancake Haus It's Not Just For Breakfast Anymore


